The Panel did not support the proposal, but agreed that there is more work to be done to try and resolve the issues outside of this process. Suggested issues for consideration included all eight North Yorkshire local authorities investigating possible land release and the designation and protection of existing allotments.
6	Proposal to generate electricity using tidal/wave power. They would like to see a transfer of funds from central government to local government to investigate this form of renewable energy. 7	Winter fuel payments for the terminally ill	Elected Member Area Forum, Hambleton	The Panel felt the proposal would provide huge benefit in times of need and support people to stay in their own home. However, further investigation has found that winter fuel payments are made to people aged 60 or over including those who are disabled or terminally ill. The heating costs of terminally ill people arise throughout the year, not just in winter and disability living allowance provides additional weekly financial support of up to £5,915 a year related to an individual's circumstances.
