## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to recommend the allocation of seats on committees to political groups and the appointment of Members to Committees for 2018/2019.

### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

That Council decides the following:.

1. That the Council divides Committee seats between political groups in accordance with the allocation shown at the attached Annex A or such alternative option which is agreed .
2. Membership of the Committees to be that shown on Annex B to be circulated at the Annual Meeting .
3. That the membership of the Licensing Committee be the same Members as appointed to the Planning Committee.
4. That the Annual Meeting of Council elects the Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen of the Standing Committees with the exception of the Licensing Committee.
5. That the terms of reference of the Policy \& Resources Committee, Licensing Committee, Overview \& Scrutiny Committee, Planning Committee and the Scheme of Officer Delegation are those set out in Part 3 of the Council's Constitution.
6. That the Interim Chief Executive be authorised to make any consequential amendments to the Constitution arising from the above.

### 3.0 REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

3.1 To allow for the allocation of seats and appointment of members to committees to which Group Leaders have agreed.
3.2 To comply with the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990 as amended.

### 4.0 BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

4.1 Ryedale District Council is to be treated as being divided into different political groups for the purposes of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, because at least one political group has been constituted in the prescribed way.
4.2 The Local Government \& Housing Act 1989 and associated regulations, requires the distribution of seats on Committees and Sub-Committees to be on the basis of political proportionality so far as it is "reasonably practicable" between the political groups of the Council unless every Member of the Council agrees that some other basis of allocation should be used.
4.3 The distribution of Committee places between the groups needs to have regard to these rules.
4.4 Political proportionality on Committees is achieved in the following two stages:-
4.4.1 the first stage is the allocation of numbers of seats on Committees to each political group.
4.4.2 the second stage is the giving effect to such allocations by appointing individual Members.

If Council adopts Annex A the political proportionality rules apply to the following Committees of the Council:-

## REPORT

### 5.0 POLICY CONTEXT

5.1 The strength of the political groups on the Council of 30 Members is as follows:-

13 (43\%) Conservatives
8 (27\%) Independents
4 (13\%) Liberals
3 (10\%)New Independents
2 (7 \%) Liberal Democrats
5.2 Given the political composition of the Council, political proportionality is considered to be achieved with the following Committee sizes:-

| Policy \& Resources |  | 10 |

| Planning Committee |  | 10 |

The seats on Committees which can be allocated between the political groups is, therefore, total 30 seats.
5.3 The numerical entitlements have been divided as follows (these being the nearest divisions for mathematical accuracy and having regard to the fact that whole numbers must be attained):-

Against this background and on the basis of group constitutions the number of seats recommended to be allocated to each political group is as follows:-

Conservative 13
Independents 8
Liberal 4
New Independents 3

5.4 Council needs to divide committee seats between political groups. The allocation of seats on committees to political groups approved by the Annual Council meeting on 18 May 2017 is shown on the attached Annex A. Given the previous decision of Annual Council on this issue this is the recommended allocation of seats. There are other options to that in Annex A which are attached as Annexes A1 and A2. It is for Council to ultimately decide which option it would prefer. To avoid the unnecessary use of Officer time, the best approach is for all political groups to agree the allocation of seats on committees to political groups before the Annual Meeting of Council. I will discuss this matter with all the political Group Leaders prior to the Annual Meeting. I will report the outcome of these discussions to Members at the Annual Meeting.
5.5 The legal obligation to ensure that there is proportionality in the political composition of Committees extends only to proportionate representation of members of political groups and does not require ungrouped single members to be proportionally represented.
5.6 Annex C outlines the procedure should any political group not make nominations.

## NON-APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS TO COMMITTEES

If any political group does not make nominations the procedure is as follows:-
Regulation 15 of the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990 makes provision for appointments to Committees in circumstances where a political group has failed to express its wishes in relation to the appointment of its members to Committees.

The Annual Council meeting on 17 May 2018 would review the allocation of seats to all political groups;

The next day the proper officer gives the group formal notice of the allocation of seats to that political group;

The group then has three weeks beginning with the date on which notice is received to make nominations;

There would be a vacancy in respect of the Committee seats allocated to the group not making a nomination of a Member for the seat until the next subsequent Council meeting after Annual Council ;

In the absence of a group making nominations within the three week period mentioned above, Council may make such appointment to that Committee seat as it thinks fit. In that event the political group may not have a seat on the Committee(s).
