Welcome: Mr. Simon McMillan was welcomed to his first Meeting.

Minutes: The Minutes of the last Meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> May 2016 having been circulated to all Members were signed as a true record.

#### Matters Roads:

The Clerk had received a letter from North Yorkshire County Council Highways Department dated 6<sup>th</sup> September 2016 the contents of which were noted, namely :

- ① Pitts Wood to Bugthorpe road corner in Birdsall - pot holes filled in on 18<sup>th</sup> May.
- ② North Brinsford to Kington Crossroads - the dangerous potholes had been filled on 16<sup>th</sup> May and 15<sup>th</sup> August.
- ③ Overlaying schemes scheduled for this year on Mile Lane and Taffings Lane, Birdsall.
- ④ Alder hill out of Birdsall - the pressure jetter attended the drain on the 4<sup>th</sup> July.
- ⑤ The Gritter tuning at Kington Crossroads is because that section of road is a Priority 1 route whereas the road to Birdsall from Kington Crossroads is a Priority 2 route.

Meeting:

Lady Middleton and Mrs. J. Sanders agreed to attend this Meeting which was to be held at Leavening Church on 13<sup>th</sup> September 2016 at 7.30 p.m. The Clerk was asked to notify Councillor Potter and to have Roads and Road Closures on his agenda.

Roads: The Clerk was asked to report the following to the NYCC Highways Department :

The new curbing on the Mill Road had narrowed the road and there should be signs to say "road narrows".

The undergrowth, ivy etc. on the bridge walls at the above point requires clearing and the white paint on the brick walls needs re-painting.

The dangerous corner in North Brinsford village - it was suggested this stretch required a "grassy surface" as vehicles were still not negotiating these corners. The 'T' junction onto the North Brinsford / Malton road from Settington - this is a very blind junction and it was suggested the hedge should be taken back to improve visibility at this junction.
