Why is the project needed?

The census figures highlight that there are 5095 people who provide unpaid care in the Ryedale district, 935 of these unpaid carers provide for 50+ hours a week, this is the third highest percentage across the sub region. The profile of the population in Ryedale is projected to continue to age. By 2027 it is estimated that the population of Ryedale will have increased by 12% to 59,300. Unpaid carers living in Ryedale are at particular risk of loneliness and are often both rurally and socially isolated. Most carers are caring for a family member in their home and struggle to find time to do essential tasks such as shopping or visiting their GP. They have little or no time for themselves and due to their caring commitments are often unable to get out socially, so lose contact with friends and family, thus isolating themselves from the outside world. Due to the decrease in rural community facilities such as shops, cafes, public houses and a lack of public transport in rural areas, carers and older people living alone are becoming increasingly isolated. Social isolation is proven to be a major factor in the lack of well-being amongst older people, leading to depression, lack of self-esteem and self-confidence. Carers and older people living in rural areas are at greater risk due to factors such as bereavement, disability, low income and lack of public transport. The North Yorkshire Health and Well Being Board has identified that loneliness and social isolation are major issues affecting older people in North Yorkshire.

RCS collects feedback from beneficiaries of the services they provide. We conduct regular surveys with all our beneficiaries and are in regular contact with our carers. The need for carers to meet with each other and provide mutual support has been highlighted and as an organisation we are responding to that need. Our evaluation demonstrates that there is demand, interest and benefits in our approach to tackling loneliness and social isolation in this way

The benefits to the carer can be measured in the following outcomes:

- · Carers are supported to stay mentally and physically well
- Carers are empowered by shared knowledge and experiences
- Increased confidence, motivation and independence
- Enhanced wellbeing within the care and cared for relationship
