	The project was established 20 years ago in response to concerns about local crime rates, particularly with reference to the night time economy. Over the last few years, the service has been withdrawn from Pickering, and the local business community feel that it needs to be reinstated as night time economy crime has increased. Evidence of need and use as a community safety tool has been provided by North Yorkshire Police.

	Support from Town and Parish Council, local business groups and North Yorkshire Police.

	There is not a business plan as such. However, cashflow has been evidenced indicating longer term viability and management of the system will now be much improved as it will be part of a larger Scarborough Borough Council established CCTV monitoring system. Delivery method is still under discussion and options regarding involvement of
