A sum of £1200.00 has already been raised by the clubs towards the running costs of the premises.

> The Community Grant grant application requested £2686.85 which was 35% of total project costs. As the maximum allowable under this scheme is 25% I have adjusted the requested figure for the Community Grant to £1926.00. This leaves the project with a shortfall of £760.85. This has been an oversight and perhaps members would consider this in their decision.
