TERMS OF REFERENCE: COMMUNITY SERVICES AND LICENSING COMMITTEE

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Community Services and Licensing Committee has the delegated powers to act on behalf of the Council on a range of issues, in accordance with the following policy framework:
 - The aims and priorities set by the Local Strategic Partnership (LSP) in the Ryedale Sustainable Community Strategy;
 - The aims and priorities set by the Council in its Corporate Plan;
 - The Council's approved revenue and capital budgets;
 - The provisions within the Council Constitution; and
 - The Council's Financial Standing Orders.
- 1.2 The Committee may also make recommendations to the Council's Policy & Resources Committee and Full Council regarding new or proposed changes to policy or where the decision is not in accordance with the policy framework.

2.0 SCOPE OF RESPONSIBILITY

- 2.1 The Committee can exercise its powers of delegation across the following services and functions:
 - Community Safety
 - Cultural Services
 - Economic Development
 - Housing Services
 - Health & Environmental Services
 - Licensing
 - Streetscene Services
 - Customer Services
- 2.2 A full description of each of these functions can be found at Appendix A.

3.0 DELEGATED POWERS

- 3.1 The Committee has delegated powers to make binding decisions subject to the proper scrutiny arrangements for its areas of responsibility as detailed in 2.1 on the following matters:
 - Implementation of statutory responsibilities;
 - Implementation of agreed priorities as contained in agreed Community, Corporate and Service Delivery Plans;
 - Implementation of agreed Capital Projects;
 - Consultation and communication with the public, local businesses and partner organisations;
 - Participation in partnership working to deliver agreed Council policies;
 - Respond to consultation exercises, on issues within the scope of the committee, on behalf of the Council.
 - Award grants to external organisations, in accordance with agreed criteria;
 - Agree the level of delegation to officers across the scope of the committee;
 - Monitoring of service budgets and performance.
- 3.2 The specific powers of the committee in relation to Taxi Licensing are to:-
 - a) Determine licence applications which have not been determined within officer delegation;
 - b) Vary, amend or revoke the standard conditions of hackney carriage or private hire operators, vehicle and drivers' licences;
 - c) Determine the fees payable for the issue and renewal of hackney carriage and private hire licences (including inspections);
 - d) Review and set the hackney carriage tariff;
 - e) Approve the siting, relocation or removal of hackney carriage ranks and to authorise the appropriate statutory notices – following appropriate consultation.
- 3.3 The specific powers of the committee in relation to Public Entertainment Licences as authorised under the Private Places of Entertainment (Licensing) Act 1967 are to:-
 - a) Determine licence applications which have not been determined within officer delegation;

- b) Vary, amend or revoke the standard conditions otherwise imposed upon the grant of a new licence;
- c) Vary the conditions attached to an existing licence upon receiving recommendations from the appropriate officers and outside bodies;
- d) Revoke licences which have not been determined within officer delegation;
- e) Determine the fees payable for applications to issue and renew licences.
- 3.4 The specific powers of the committee in relation to Animal Welfare as authorised under Part I and Schedule I of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, and any related regulations, directions and guidance notices are to:
 - a) Impose conditions upon the grant of authorisations and to review those conditions in accordance with the time period set out in the legislation;
 - b) Vary authorisations;
 - c) Determine applications to vary made by the holder of an authorisation;
 - d) Grant licences under the provisions of the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976.
- 3.5 The specific powers of the committee in relation to all other licenses are to:-
 - a) Grant and renew licences and permits on recommendations from the appropriate officers and outside bodies and to impose conditions;
 - b) Vary the conditions attached to an existing licence or permit upon receiving recommendations from the appropriate officers and outside bodies;
 - c) Determine the licence fees payable;
 - d) Vary, amend or revoke the standard conditions imposed upon the grant of amusements with prizes permits and licences;

4.0 REFERALS TO POLICY & RESOURCES COMMITTEE

- 4.1 As part of its business the Committee can also consider issues that fall outside its full delegation and make recommendations to the Policy & Resources Committee for approval. Examples of referrals could include:
 - New policy or changes to existing policy;
 - Development of new proposals for Capital expenditure;
 - Spending requirements greater than agreed revenue and capital budgets.

5.0 REFERALS TO COUNCIL

- 5.1 Occasionally recommendations will be made directly to Full Council. This will be done where the decision is within the terms of reference of Council. Examples of referrals to Council include:
 - Changes to the Constitution;
 - Amendment to the Terms of Reference of the Committee;
 - Delegating functions to other Local Authorities or proposed new partnerships.

- Sport & Active Recreation;
- Sports facilities and leisure centres;
- Public Open Spaces and recreation grounds including: parks; picnic areas; woodlands; nature reserves; amenity areas and play areas;

- All matters relating to the discharge of the Council's licensing functions pursuant to the Licensing Act 2003 including all statutory and regulatory obligations as the Licensing Authority for:-
 - Hackney Carriage and Private Hire vehicles (Taxis and Minicabs);
 - Public Entertainment Licences;
 - Amusements with prizes;
 - Betting Tracks and Casinos;
 - Sex Establishments:
 - Dangerous Wild Animals;
 - Nursing Agencies;
 - Piercing and Tattooing establishments;
 - Premises selling Alcohol;
 - Cinemas;
 - House to House & Street Collections.

7. STREETSCENE

- Car Parking
- Waste Collection & Recycling
- Public Conveniences

- Fleet Management
- Provision and management of Council retail markets

8. CUSTOMER SERVICES

- Reception, Area Office and Front of House services;
- Customer Standards.
