Other items which were discussed:

- The Working Party agreed that except for motions which can be moved without notice under Rule 12, notice of every motion should be submitted no later than 5pm, eight working days before the date of the meeting.
- The Working Party agreed that questions on notice at Council should be submitted no later than 5pm, eight working days before the date of the meeting.
- The Working Party agreed that urgent questions with the consent of the chairman to whom the question is to be put should be given to the proper officer by 12 noon on the day of the meeting.
- Further research is to be done by officers into the cost and viability of video recordings at Council and committee meetings.
- The Working Party agreed that where necessary Council procedure rule 21 should be amended to reflect the relevant provisions in the Openness of Local Government Bodies Regulations 2014 allowing the press and public to film and digitally report from all public meetings of local government bodies.
- The Working Party discussed the committee structure and there was a
  desire from some members that there should be greater delegated
  authority to the committees in the future.
