**QUARTER 1 2014/15/16** 

- Skip delivered to York Road, Flaxton (Cost £240.00)
- 19<sup>th</sup> November 2014
- To prevent travellers on ASBO disposing of their old caravan by burning it on a public highway. This course of action was identified to avoid a risk to the public due to toxic smoke, burning of the hedges, trees and verge in the surrounding area, coupled with resultant ASB complaints.
- Despite requests from the Crime & Disorder Officer and NYP this family have disposed of caravans by burning them on the roadside, it was identified on a routine visit that a new caravan had been acquired, therefore, the disposal of the old one would shortly be taking place. In the past three years the family have burnt three caravans on the roadside.

#### **OUTCOMES & INDICATORS OF SUCCESS:**

#### **OUTCOME 1:**

Co-ordinated response to ASB issues and delivery of ASB interventions. Positive relationship between agencies and the family, reduction in the detrimental impact on the wider community and reinforced education as to the seriousness of the family's actions on the countryside and public.




